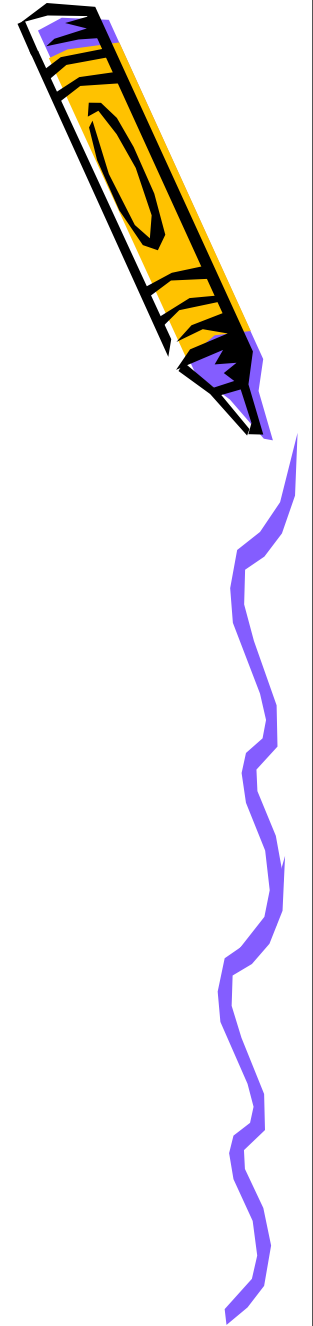


# GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- Planning 10 (4 )

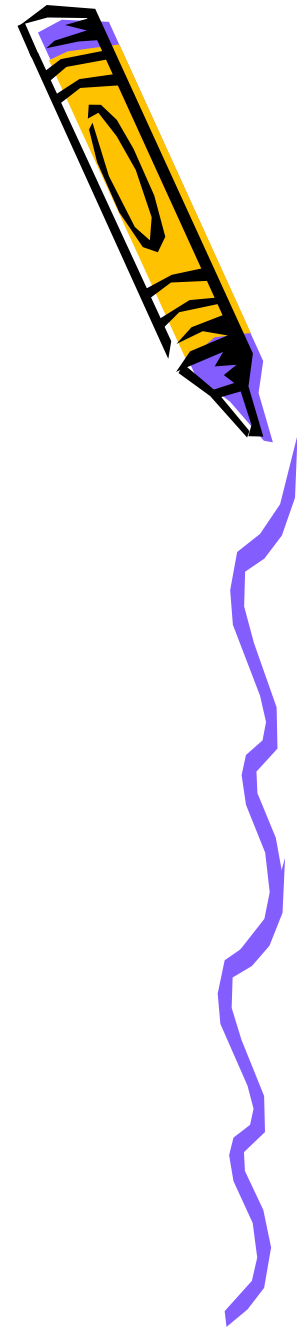

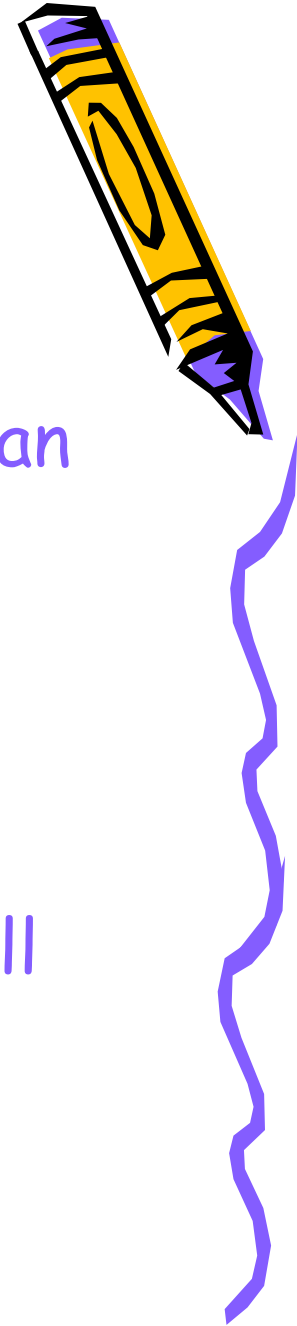

# GRAD REQUIREMENTS...

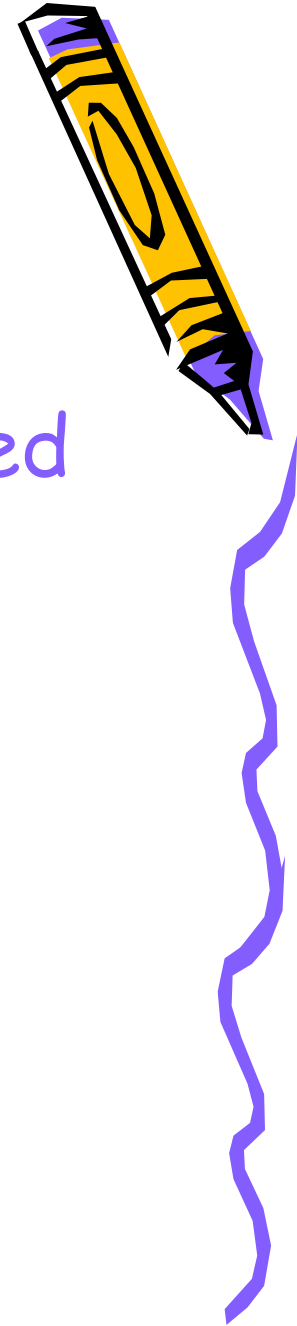
- Student's status is being monitored on an ongoing basis.

We cannot guarantee that all students will be identified so, if you have concerns, please contact the school.



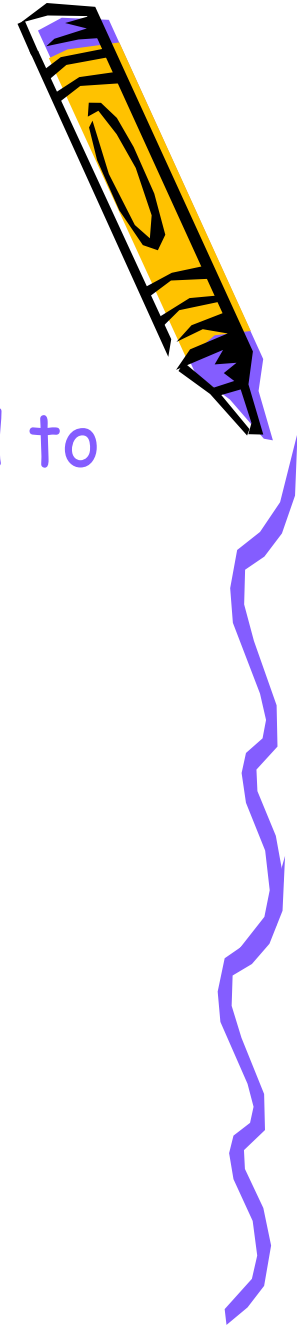
# GRAD REQUIREMENTS...

- Students are constantly encouraged (reminded) to be aware of their graduation requirements.
- Graduation requirements are most often not exactly the same as requirements to enter post secondary institutions.



# GRADUATION TRANSITIONS

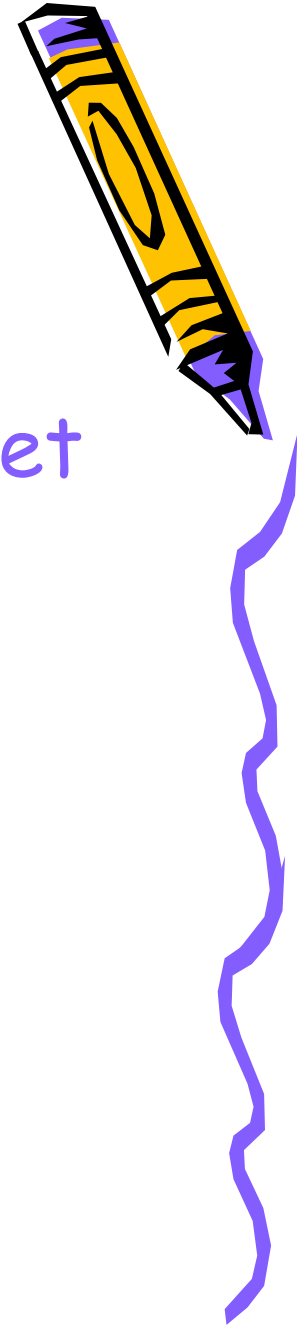
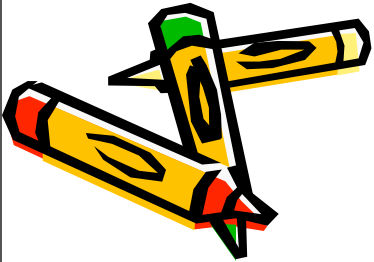
- What Parents and Students really need to know:
- As of September 2007, Graduation Transition Planning replaced Portfolio Assessment.
- Graduation Transition is intended to prepare students for a successful transition to life after school.



# STUDENTS IN GRADES 12

Must demonstrate that they have met  
the following requirements:

- Personal Health...
- Community Connections...
- Career and Life.

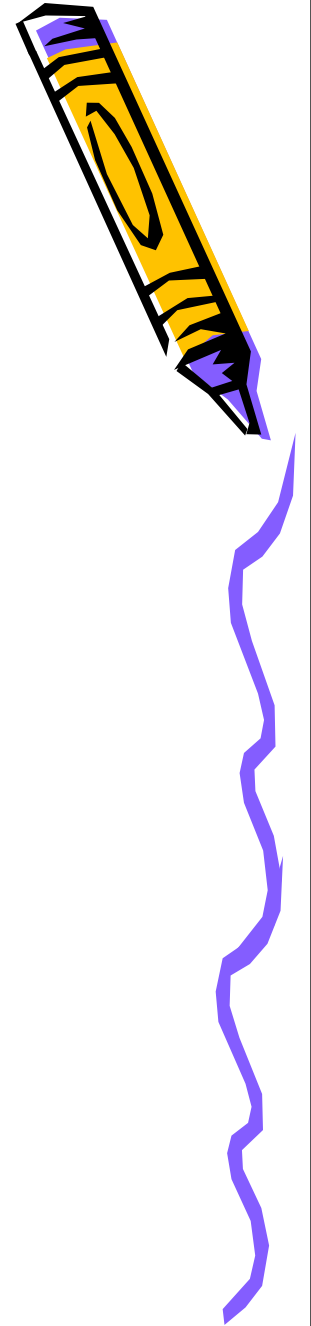
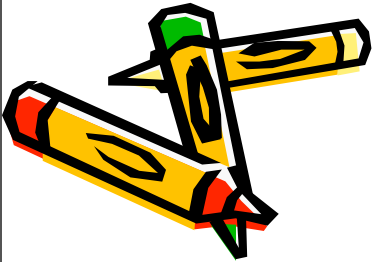

# PERSONAL HEALTH

Develop a healthy living plan  
appropriate to the student's  
lifestyle:

- Sound nutritional habits...
- Emotional health management...
- Positive health decisions.



# COMMUNITY CONNECTIONS

- Documentation can take the form of an **Activity Log** where multiple entries are recorded and signed off by a responsible party...or,
- A **Confirmation of Community Connections** letter from an employer, activity organizer, or an individual.



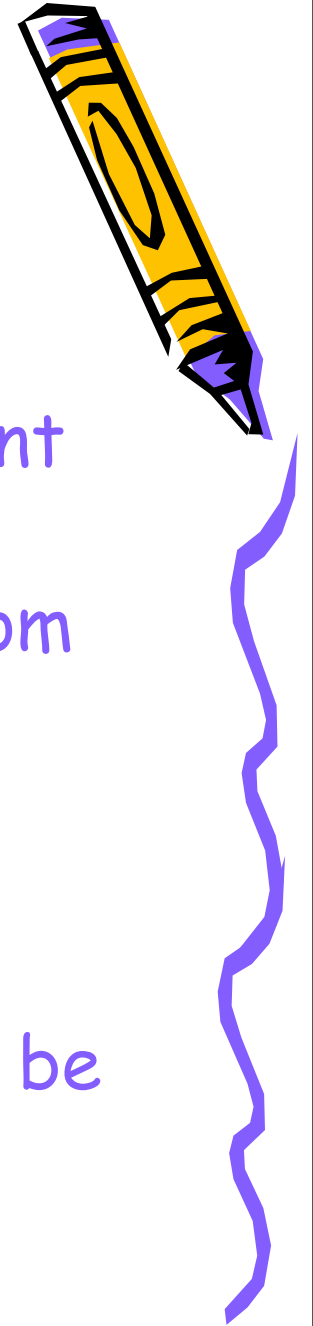
# COMMUNITY CONNECTIONS

- Students must participate in at least 30 hours of Work Experience and/or Community Service.
- Work Experience can be paid work.



# CAREER AND LIFE

- This component involves the development of a comprehensive plan that indicates preparation to successful transition from Secondary School to:
  - Post Secondary/Training or,
  - Work or,
  - Travel (it is expected that work/travel be combined).



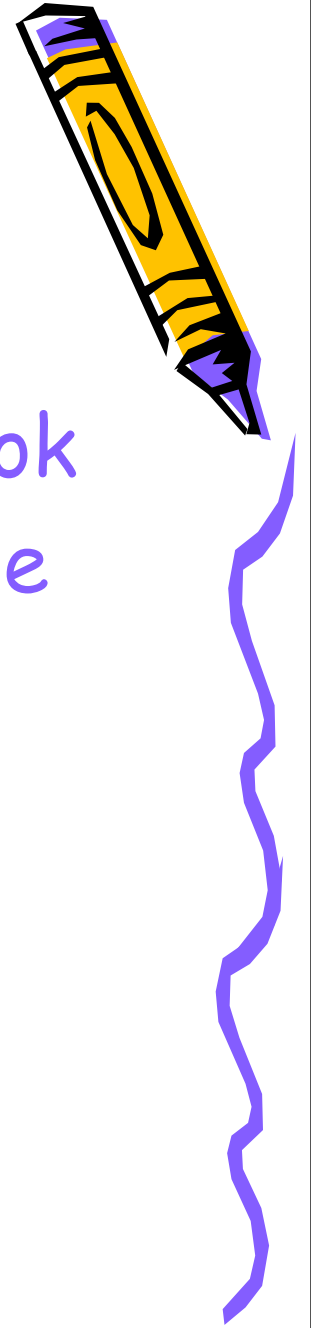
# GRADUATION TRANSITION IMPORTANT POINTS TO NOTE

- Graduation Transition is worth 4 mandatory credits.
- All 3 elements must be completed to receive credit for this requirement.
- A letter grade is not assigned. Student will receive an "RM (requirement met).

# CONGRATULATIONS!

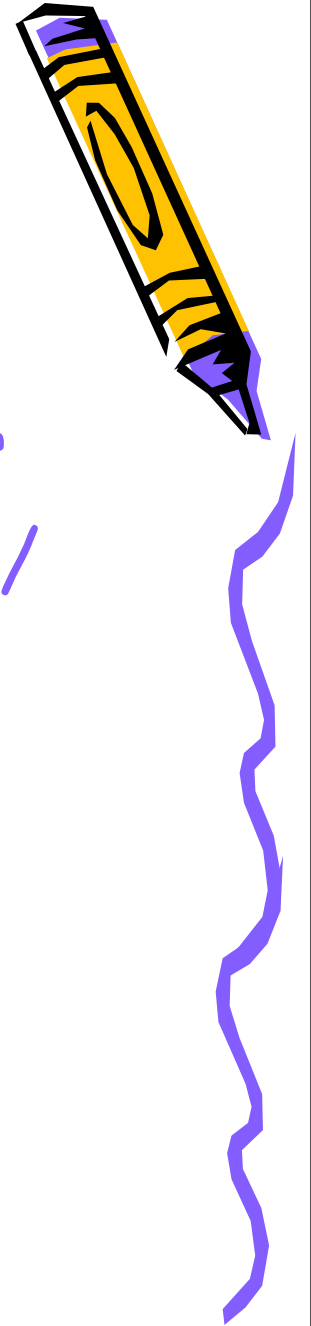
Once the 3 components of the Graduation Transition Plan have been completed:

- It must be submitted to the identified Graduation Transition Tracker (Dietiker/Falls/Pitre/Somers).
- An exit Interview scheduled.

# DAILY PHYSICAL ACTIVITY (DPA)

- Effective September 2008 the Ministry of education has mandated DPA.
- For Grades 10-12...150 minutes per week.



# DAILY PHYSICAL ACTIVITY (DPA)...

- Documentation can take the form of an **Activity Log** (calendar) where multiple entries can be made and signed off by a responsible party...or
- A **Confirmation of Physical Activity** letter from a team, club coach, or individual.



# DPA...

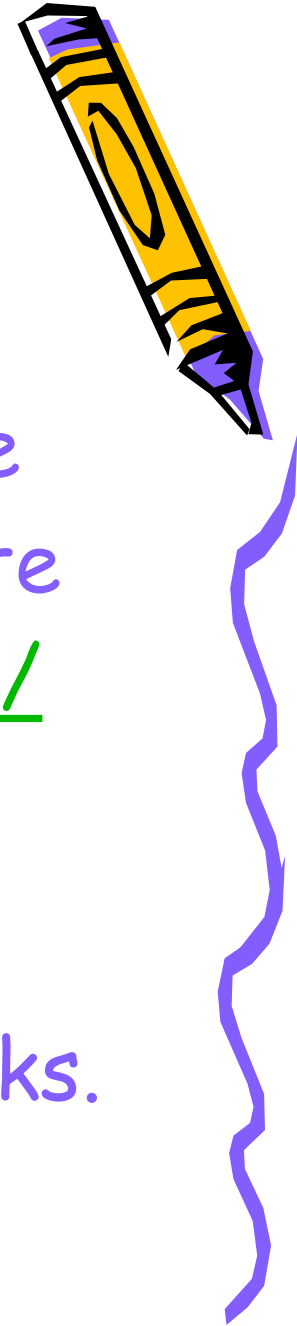
- Forms are distributed and collected during Advisory Period. This is the first part of Period 1 on Friday mornings.
- Forms can also be picked up/dropped off in the office.

These forms allow post secondary institutions to access student marks.



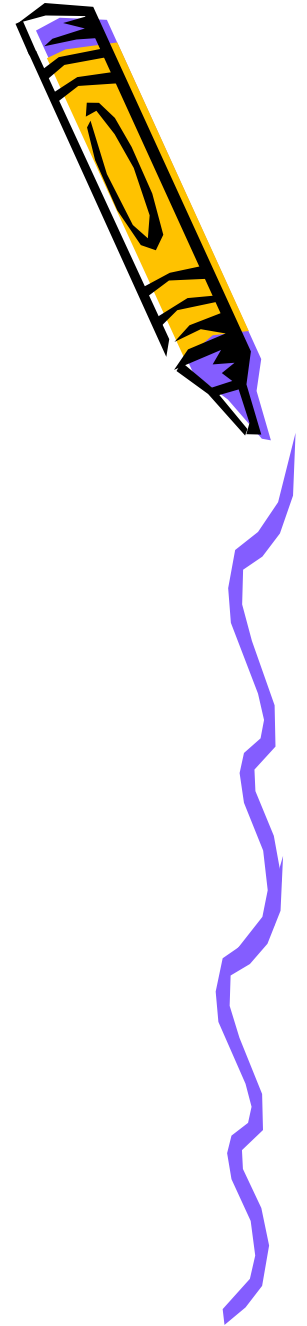

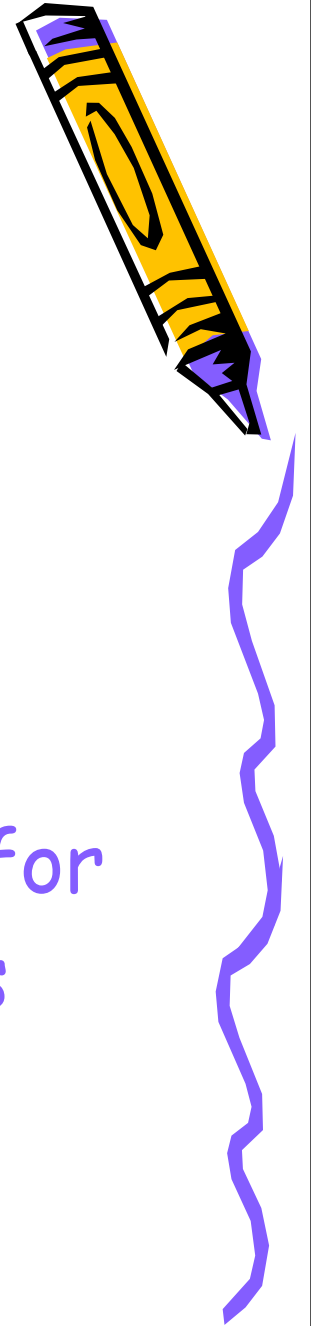

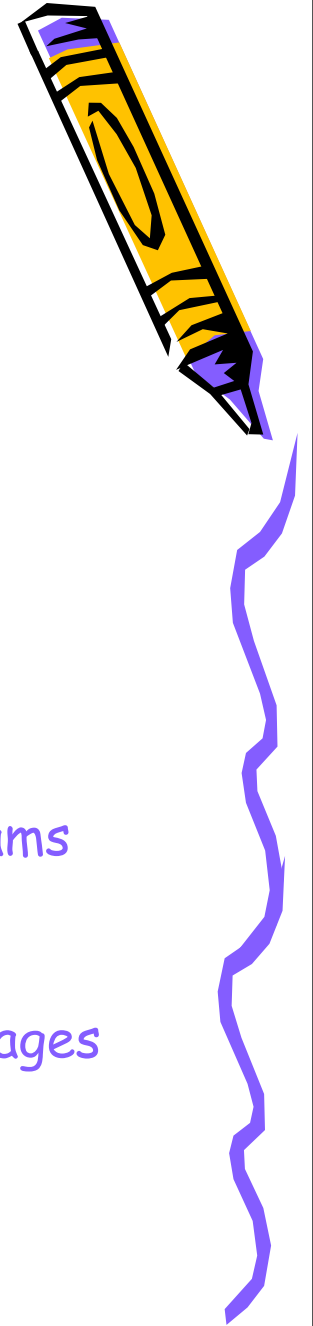
Check with...

# GOVERNMENT SCHOLARSHIPS

- Passport to Education
  - is your son/ daughter taking enough courses at LP?
- Gr. 12 Exams Scholarships
  - 3 scores of 86% or better = \$1000
  - a reason for strong students to write provincial exams
- Dogwood Scholarships
  - Fine Arts, Applied Skills, Physical Activity or Languages
  - it's time to start work on portfolios (due in May)



# PASSPORT TO EDUCATION

To be eligible for

PASSPORT TO EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP \$'s

- in Grade 10: \$250 you need 8 courses\* at LP
- in Grade 11: \$250 you need 8 courses\* at LP
- in Grade 12: \$500 you need 7 courses\* at LP

\* A course is any 4-credit course—inside or outside the timetable.

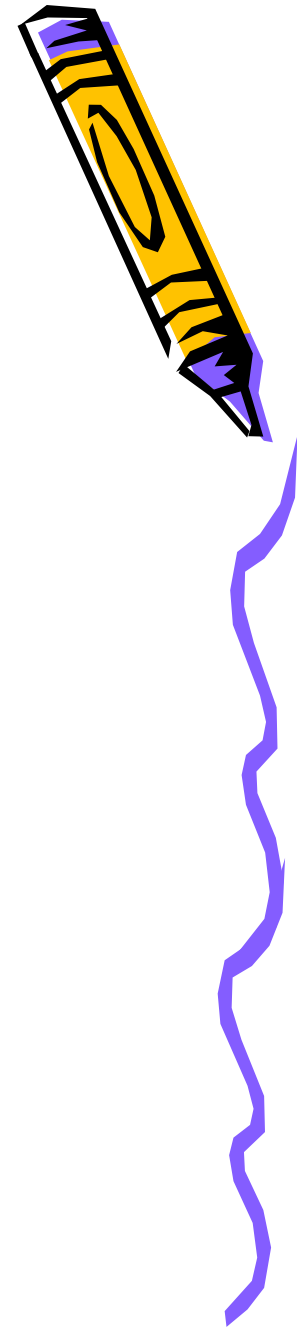
- Selection for Passport to Education Awards is based on:
  - GPA for courses taken at Lambrick Park and
  - criteria such as work habits, citizenship and school/ community involvement

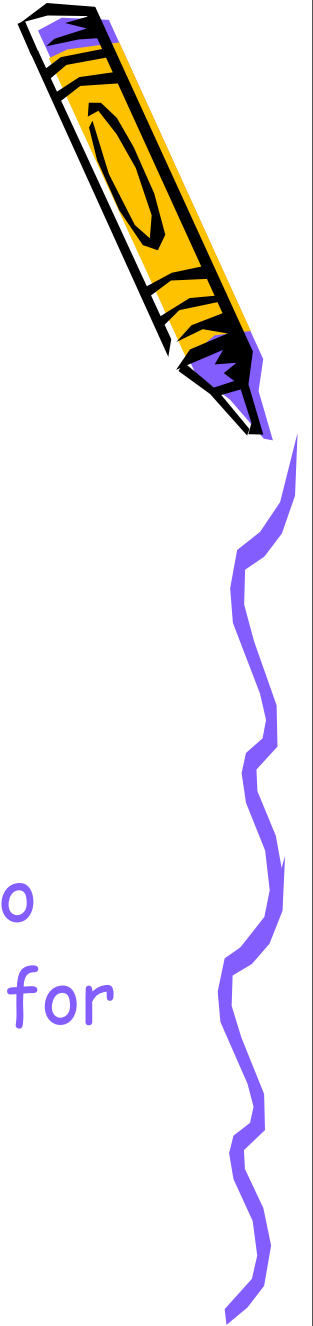

# GRADUATION EVENTS

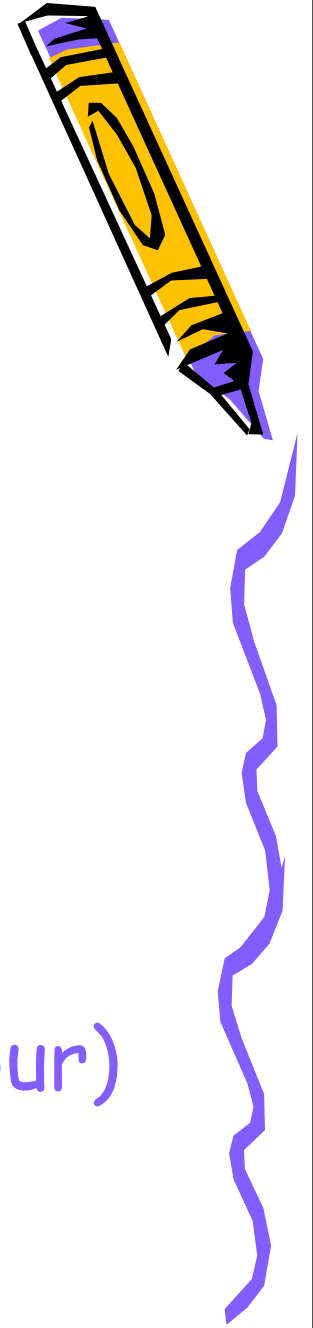
- Various Graduation Events are planned throughout the year.

to attend these events.

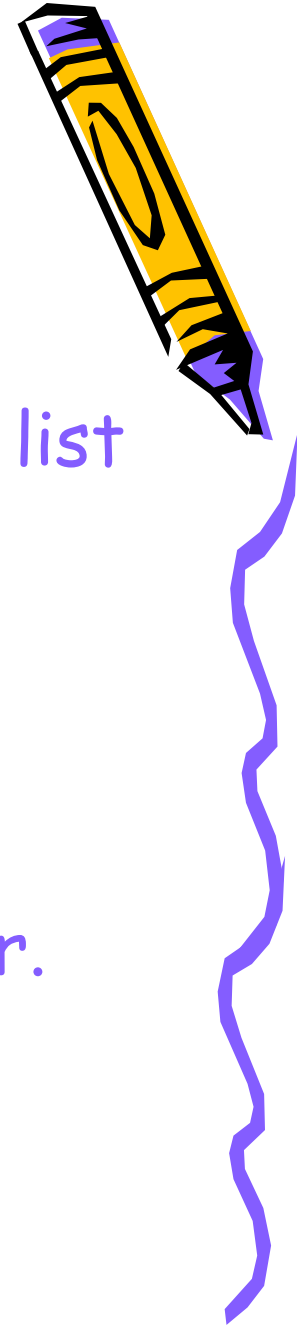


# GRADUATION EVENTS NOT SUPPORTED
