SHAKESPEARE VIDEO PROJECTS - ENGLISH 10 & 12

The Shakespeare video project is an end of unit project that all students in Mr. Fraser's English classes complete. This includes English 10, 11, and 12. Students participate in a group of two to five members. The group is required to perform and videotape a ten minute *'interpretative'* drama of a scene or part of a scene in the play. Groups select a scene from the story, and act out a short drama emphasizing a major motif or theme within the story. Students are responsible for all technical and technological aspects of the planning and implementation.

This second semester students performed **William Shakespeare's Julius Caesar** for **grade 10** and **Hamlet** for **grade 12**.

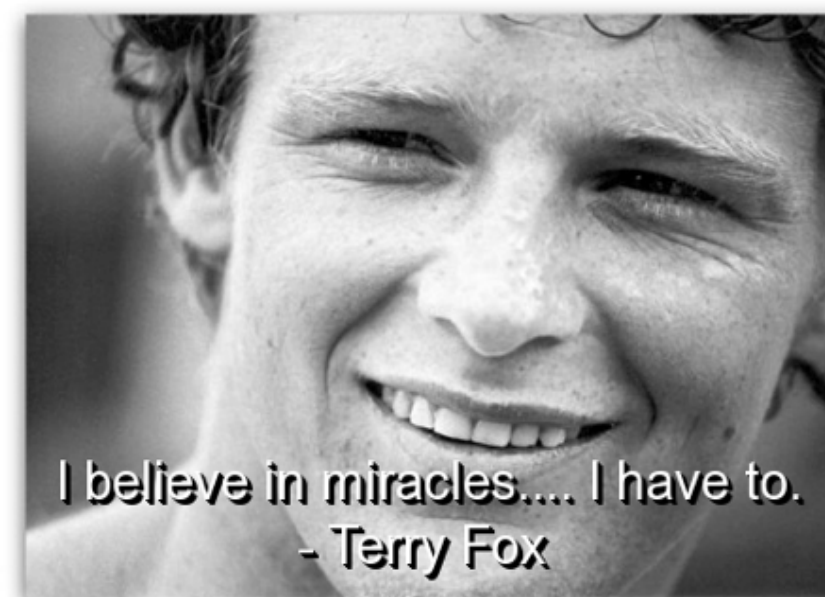
