Surveys are to be completed by parents with children in Grades 4, 7, 10, and 12. A parent may complete a survey for each child in the targeted grades.


The parent survey is available in English, French and 16 other languages.

Dear Superintendents and Principals:

Measles Cases on Vancouver Island.

Vancouver Island has been experiencing an increase in measles with six cases identified since early March. Measles is a viral infection which presents with fever, runny nose, sore throat, cough, diarrhea and red eyes, followed a few days later by a rash that starts on the face and spreads to the chest. The illness can be severe in some cases. Measles spreads very easily by air and nonimmune people can become infected simply being in the same room with someone who has measles, even after the infectious person has left the room.

The best way to prevent measles is through immunization. Two doses of measles, mumps rubella (MMR) vaccine are recommended for individuals born on or after January 1, 1970; those born before that date are considered to be immune. Recommended childhood vaccinations for MMR are at 12 months of age, with a second dose at 4-6 years of age. We are not currently recommending early vaccination of children aged 6-12 months or an early second dose (prior to 4 years of age) for children who have had one dose of MMR and are under 4 years of age.

Measles in Schools

Because of the recent increase in measles, there is a real potential for a case to occur in a school setting. Should a case occur in a school, measles control strategies would be required in order to prevent spread. These control strategies may include the following:

- Exclusion of students from a school that has had a measles case unless they can provide documented proof of past measles vaccination OR documented evidence of measles immunity based on a laboratory test. The exclusion would continue until the Medical Health Officer determines there is no further risk of measles spread in the school.
- For students who have had only a single dose of MMR vaccine, a second dose of MMR vaccine will be required and will be provided by public health.
- Staff who are not immune to measles and who work at a school that has had a measles case may be excluded from work.

This exclusion would include staff who:

- were born on or after January 1, 1970, AND
- do not have documented proof of past measles vaccination, AND
- do not have documented evidence of measles immunity base on a laboratory test.

Given recent measles activity on Vancouver Island and in order to reduce the impact on schools, students and staff, we encourage all school staff to review their immunization status now to ensure they are immune to measles. If required, MMR immunization can be arranged by contacting their family doctor, pharmacy or local travel clinic. The local public health unit can provide more information. Measles immunization is free for everyone.
